Subject:-Grant of Conditional Permission to Sanskriti Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, 28 KM. Stone, Chhatam Mathura-281401, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0503), for intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, for the academic session 2022-23, under Section 28of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provisions of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government notified that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. In view of the above the Central Government constituted the Autonomous Boards with effect from 11th June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder.

Further, the provisions of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provisions of NCISM Act 2020 shall not be applicable.

- 1. Further, your institution, namely Sanskriti Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, 28 KM. Stone, Chhatam Mathura-281401, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0503) was assessed on hybrid mode as part of Annual visitation on 26.07.2022 & 27.07.2022, by the visitation team of Medical Assessment & Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), to assessthe available facilities of teaching and practical training for intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, for the academic session 2022-23, under Section 28 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.
- After analyzing the assessment report, the matter was placed in the 14th Board Meeting of Medical Assessment & Rating Board, NCISM held on 31.10.2022. The Board, on examining the assessment report in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (requirement of minimum standard for Undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges & attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 & relevant regulations thereunder, it is found that your College is fulfilling notified & approved criteria for issuing Conditional Permission for 100 seats In UG (BAMS) course, for the academic session 2022-23.
- 3. Therefore, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) to grant Sanskriti Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, 28 KM. Stone, Chhatam Mathura-281401, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0503), for conducting 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, for the academic session 2022-23, under Section 28 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, subject to following condition:-
  - The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month from the date of Issue of the letter, explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying fee same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948and relevant Rules and Regulations.
  - It is further informed that 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 UG (BAMS) seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2022-23 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college falls to comply with the

aforesald direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.

- It is also informed that the determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in Private III. Medical Institutions and Deemed to be Universities should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref.no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of the respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 4. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 5. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 6. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2022 to get permission for the session 2023-24:
  - all the requirements of Minimum Standard of Infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian MedicineCentralCouncil(Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;

all the requirementsoftheIndlanMedicineCentralCouncil(MinimumStandards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);

- all the requirements, under the provisions of the NCISM Act-2020 and relevant Regulations, made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
- 7. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2023-24.
